

THE 2023 Theodist National Swimming Championship was held over the weekend of 29-30 April at Taurama Aquatic Centre 50m pool complex. This prestigious event on the PNGSI calendar brought together our talented and enthusiastic swimmers (Age and Masters swimmers) training in the National Capital and Queensland from Boroko Amateur Swim Club (BASC).

A feeling of excitement and eager anticipation was felt by our swimmers as they raced the clock swimming against their fellow training mates eager to improve.

There were some excellent performances from the eighty-four (84) swimmers who competed in their individual events over the three sessions of competition, many personal best times were swum and nine PNG National Records recorded which included one age record and seven Masters records.



RECORDS were set by:

Individual Age Record:

 Female swimmer, Jhnayali Tokome-Garap took the 50m Backstroke record for the 14-year age, swimming a finish time of 34.28. The previous record time of 34.69 was held by Nicole Comerford set in 1995.

PNG Masters Records:

- Female 40-44 Age Division, Michelle Garbutt took the 50m Freestyle record clocking a finish time of 32.09 previously held by Louise Franklin 38.53 set in 1998.
- Female 40-44 Age Division, Michelle Garbutt took the 100m Freestyle record clocking a finish time of 1:18.05, previously held by Robbie Dunstan 1:51.96 set in 2005.
- Female 40-44 Age Division, Kaye Kahn set a new 50m Butterfly record clocking a finish time of 47.16.
- Female 55-59 Age Division, Tracy Nen set a new 50m Freestyle record clocking a finish time of 1:07.08.
- Male 55-59 Age Division, Warwick Vele took the 50m Freestyle record clocking a finish time of 32.73, previously held by Francis Tau 34.11 set in 2015.
- Male 60-64 Age Division, Francis Tau set a new in the 50m Backstroke clocking a finish time of 40.16.
- Male 60-64 Age Division, Francis Tau set a new in the 100m Freestyle clocking a finish time of 1:19.30.

BUILDING WORLD CLASS LEADERSHIP IN SPORTS Go Rural to Go Global







BUILDING World Class Leadership Strategy Workshop was held over two days at the Taurama Aquatic and Indoor Centre's VIP Room, from the 29-30 June, 2023.

The President of Papua New Guinea Swimming Inc. Elizabeth Wells received an invitation to participate and give a presentation on the development strategies Swimming PNG has undertaken to develop leadership capacity to sustain the sport, she was accompanied by Beatrice Geita PNGSI CTO.

"Papua New Guinea Sports Foundation are in the process of designing a Building World Class Sports Leadership Strategy to support the Go Rural to Go Global Program and were seeking insights and experiences from organizations that have successfully implemented leadership programs in the sports industry," said Vavine Yore.

"Considering PNG Swimming's commendable reputation in promoting swimming and

fostering leadership development within the sports community, we would appreciate the opportunity to learn from PNGSI experience in this area, as we believe that the knowledge and expertise gained from PNGSI's journey could significantly contribute to the development of our strategy."

Present also was the PNG Sports Foundation CEO Albert Veratau, PNG Olympic Committee Secretary General Auvita Rapilla and the Minister for Sports Hon. Don Pomb Polye alongside other sporting organizations asked to share their experiences: PNGRFL, PNG Basketball, PNG Cricket, and PNGFA were in attendance with the PNGSF staff.

"We are privileged to be conducting our first building world class sports leadership workshop with the National Federations, attended by the Minister for Sports Hon. Don Pomb Polye", said PNG Sports Foundation CEO Albert Veratau.

The workshop was designed to look at leadership in sports through governance, coaches, technical officials focusing on talent identification and development pathways.

"We must strive as leaders to do better, providing promotion for change, guiding all, (players, athletes, coaches, technical officials) to do their best, give their best, and perform at their best," said Albert Veratau.

It was stressed that Sports' Leadership involves giving direction to members as well as energizing and motivating them so that they get committed to a particular vision in sports. Effective leadership does not only require passion and being visionary, but it needs leaders who have adequate leadership skills and a strong ability to work under pressure.

Effective leaders must ensure understanding a sport organization's internal systems but also the external environment as they are constantly exposed to new and challenging situations.
